Proposed allocation of funding 2017/2018 sports, PE and Promoting Healthy Lifestyles

The Sports Funding was allocated against:

- The salary costs for a PE (including swimming) specialist teacher across the school to allow access to new sports.
- To pay for activities during our annual Sports Week in the Summer Term: e.g. specialist coaches, supply to cover staff leading sports sessions.
- Healthy & Active Lifestyle course for selected pupils to support families in making conscious choices.
- The running of sports related qualifications for children from Reception up to Year 6 e.g. Bikeability and Scooter Training.
- Using external agencies to support class teachers in the delivery of specialist sport lessons such as a professional tennis coach.
- Occupational Therapy training for teachers and teaching assistants as well as resources related to these.
- A contribution towards school journey, which promotes active outdoor activities and a healthy lifestyle.
- Research into the impact of swimming skills development and its link to fine motor skills and thus handwriting in Reception classes.
- Promoting sports leadership across the school through work with Chelsea Football Club.
- New sports equipment for inclusive sports.

Objective for Initiatives

- To develop an enjoyment of sport and physical activity and promoting a healthy lifestyle in children from an early age;
- Inspiring children of all abilities to continue the sporting legacy of the London 2012 Olympic Games;
- As a self-reviewing and evaluating school, we will monitor the impact of the funding through our annual parent and pupil surveys.

Monitoring

- The PE/Sports Subject Leader will oversee this in partnership with the Senior Leadership Team who will look at the impact and progress sports funding has had on pupil progress and involvement.
