<p>Vincent Van Gogh</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dutch post-impressionist painter • Known for bold use of colour. • Used a range of expressive brush strokes. • Most famous for using thick impasto for texture. 	<p>Stippling is used to create shading, texture, or intricate details in painting.</p> <p>Dry Brush Technique is used to create a scratchy, broken effect and can add detail to areas within a painting.</p>
