surrealism	A dream-like style of art with fantastical and bizarre elements that don't follow the rules of reality.
culture	The beliefs, practices, and characteristics of a geographical, racial, religious, or social group.
style	A personal way by which something is done, created, or performed.
mixed media	Combining different forms of art into one piece, e.g. mixing painting with collage.
elements	The distinct parts that make up a whole piece of art.
composition	The way in which the elements are put together/placed.
