






Vishnu: the god of preservation. Why or why not?</p> </div> <div style="width: 30%;"> <p style="text-align: center;">Living</p>  <p>If you believed in reincarnation, how might it change the way you live your life?</p> </div> </div>	<div style="text-align: center;"> <p>Key Knowledge: Hinduism</p>  <p>The Trimurti are the three main gods in Hinduism: Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva.</p>  <p>The cycle of existence: Creation: Brahma Preservation: Vishnu Destruction: Shiva</p> <p>The Trimurti represent the cycle of life/existence.</p> <p>This cycle can be seen in nature, such as in the seasons.</p> </div>	<div style="display: flex; flex-direction: column;"> <div style="margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>Hindu</p> <p>A person who follows the religion of Hinduism.</p> </div> <div style="margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>Brahman</p> <p>The supreme God in Hinduism, believed to be everywhere and everything.</p> </div> <div style="margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>deity</p> <p>A god or goddess.</p> </div> <div style="margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>Trimurti</p> <p>The three main gods in Hinduism.</p> </div> <div style="margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>dharma</p> <p>The good and moral way to live, including duties and responsibilities.</p> </div> <div style="margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>karma</p> <p>The belief that what you do will come back to you, in this life or in the next.</p> </div> <div style="margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>Samsara</p> <p>The cycle of birth, death, and rebirth that all souls go through.</p> </div> <div style="margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>reincarnation</p> <p>The belief that when someone dies, their soul is born again in a new body.</p> </div> <div style="margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>moksha</p> <p>The goal of Hinduism, where the soul is freed from the cycle of reincarnation and becomes one with Brahman.</p> </div> <div style="margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>atman</p> <p>The soul or spirit inside every living being, which is a part of Brahman and never dies.</p> </div> </div>
