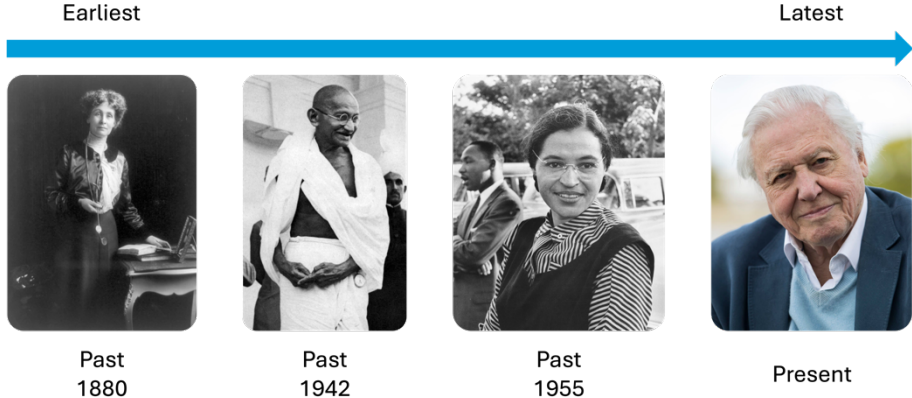

				after	Behind, or later than something else.
				earliest	The event that happened before other events; the first.
				latest	The event that happened after other events; the last.
				significant	A person, place or thing (including events) that are very special and important OR has changed people's lives.
SIGNIFICANT PEOPLE				commemorate	To remember someone or something significant.
Emmeline Pankhurst - Wanted women to be able to vote, just like men. - Gave speeches and led protests. - Thanks to her, women in the UK can now vote.	Mahatma Ghandi - Wanted his country to be free from British rule. - Taught people peaceful ways to protest. - Inspired people to stand up for what's right.	Rosa Parks - People were being treated unfairly because of their skin colour. - Refused to give up her bus seat to a white person. - Part of a significant event in the Civil Rights Movement.	David Attenborough - Produces wildlife documentaries. - Raised awareness about issues with the environment. - Does conservation work to look after the environment.	timeline	A way of showing events in the order that they happened in.
